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POSITION: SAFETY COORDINATOR

The Safety Manager is responsible for taking complete ownership leading the company's efforts to create a culture of safety by developing and enforcing all safety rules and work practices for the company. This position must lead by example by personally modeling safe work practices at all times, while always encouraging all team members and managers to always employ all company safety policies. This person must lead regular safety meetings with team members and consistently report action items and progress to management.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Perform and document detailed monthly safety inspections for active jobs (we only work commercial)
- Identify risks, develop corrective actions, and review all the inspections with the Department Manager to ensure appropriate repairs and/or changes required to bring personnel, equipment and facility into compliance.
- Report and analyze all incidents, accidents and near misses according to reporting procedures for medical, light-duty, lost time, and vehicle incidents to determine root cause.
- Research injury, accident, and claim trends for the purpose of implementing corrective programs and/or recommend alternative courses of action to reduce incidents of accidents and claims.
- Work with outside regulatory agency inspectors (for example, building inspectors, Fire Marshall, OSHA, etc.).
- Participate in required committees as needed and requested.
- Coordinate safety memorandums.
- Coordinate safety education and training for all team members within the Company.
- Act as safety liaison between team members, departments and Management.
- Inspect and monitor all fire protection systems.
- Conduct new hire safety orientations
